1. The Africana Studies major with concentration in health and environment requires the completion of the following 6 courses (18 cr): AFRS 1100, 2170, 3290, 4000, 4010, and one of the following: AFRS 2153, 2160, and 2161.
2. Cross-listed courses may also be considered for fulfillment of the major requirements.
3. Students who minor in AFRS must have 18 credit hours [ AFRS 1100, 4010, six credits at the 2000 Level, and six credits at the 3000/4000 Levels].
4. You automatically qualify for AFRS Honors with 3.25 GPA in courses counted toward the major and taken at UNC Charlotte, and 3.0 GPA for all coursework at UNC Charlotte.
5. You may qualify for early entry into AFRS Graduate Certificate if have 3.2 overall GPA and have completed 75 credit hours.
